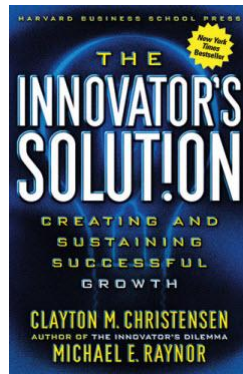

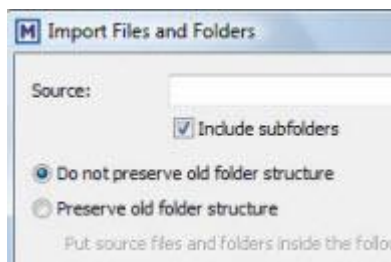
Tech Tip
